- We implemented a mini-grant program for the first time and awarded over \$49,000 to teachers. What a great way for teachers to start the school year with financial assistance to get their classroom ready and a strong message of support from our community.
- We partnered with Humble ISD to strengthen alumni relations. Many of our Humble ISD alumni return to the Lake Houston area to raise their families and we look forward to planning fun events for them to reengage with old friends and Humble ISD. - In the 24-year history of awarding Innovative Education grants to Humble ISD educators, we awarded the highest amount ever in May 2023 - \$324,478!

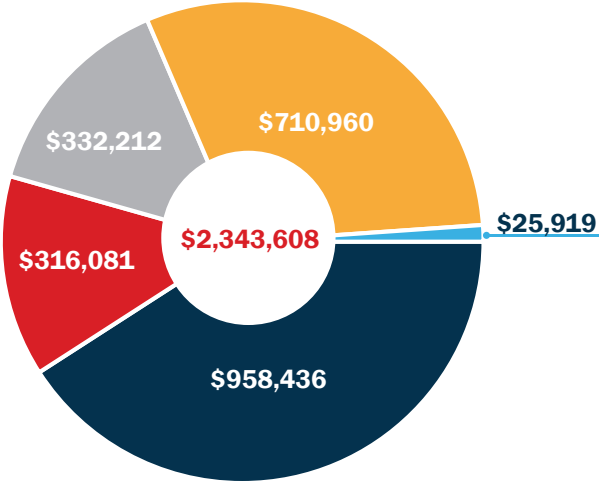

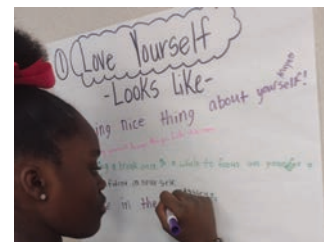
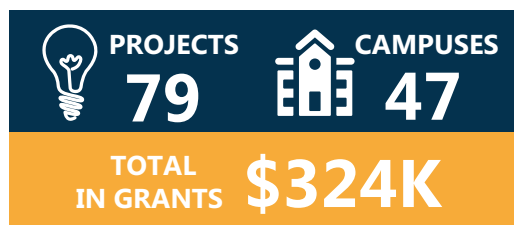


GRANTS IN ACTION

This year has marked a historic milestone for our Innovative Education Grant Program. In May 2023, we proudly awarded the highest amount of funds since the program's inception, an **impressive \$324,478!** These grants were a catalyst for **79 innovative projects**, enriching the educational journey of students and empowering educators to implement new strategies both within and beyond the classroom setting. Here are two projects awarded, and you can watch videos on more projects like these on our website.

The Girls Above Pressure (GAP) Social Club provides a safe space for girls in 3rd through 5th grade to discover their girl power! Club members engage in group discussions on diverse topics, including building friendships, resolving conflicts, and fostering self-love. These discussions serve as a foundation for hands-on projects during meetings that align with the explored themes. These projects range from self-discovery and affirmations to developing interpersonal skills and emotional maturity.

In addition to these activities, the club establishes a strong connection with our community and inspirational women in leadership. The club hosts guest speakers who are local business owners, community visionaries, and campus trailblazers. These speakers exemplify the very skills that the girls are diligently cultivating on their journey of growth.



The Future Scientist Initiative Program inspires a new generation of scientists by fostering a deep curiosity about the world through engaging science outreach initiatives. High school students assume the role of mentors and lead an electrifying series of outreach adventures at elementary and middle schools in Humble ISD. These high school scientists cover a range of captivating subjects, including Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Aerospace, and Ecology.

By engaging elementary, middle, and high school students in interactive and captivating science activities, the initiative lays the foundation for a lifelong passion for science and meaningful contributions to society. Terra Farmer, Kingwood High School Science Instructor, said, "Our high school students are even more passionate about science as a result and we saw the 'spark' in the eyes of our future science students."



MINI GRANTS BIG WIN

The "Mini Grants Big Win" initiative awarded 108 mini grants, totaling \$49,170, to teachers within Humble ISD as they prepared for the start of the school year. These educators used the grant funds to acquire materials that would amplify their teaching methods, including flexible seating options, essential school supplies, and classroom books, all aimed at enriching their students' learning environment.



The Humble ISD Education Foundation partnered with local organizations and donors to award **228 scholarships** to graduating seniors totaling **\$244,900**.

These scholarship recipients are destined for great achievements. Megan Tarkington, a past recipient, is already leaving a significant impact on the upcoming generation of educators and leaders. Megan Tarkington graduated from Kingwood High School in 2019 and received the Humble Area Retired Teacher Association Scholarship. Megan graduated from Sam Houston State University with a Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Business and a minor in Secondary Education. She pursued this degree not only because of her love for the agriculture industry, but also because of the impact her teachers had on her. "Many teachers throughout the years have instilled in me a passion for education." This fall, Megan began her career as an agricultural science teacher in Humble ISD. "The scholarship I received from the Humble ISD Education Foundation and HARTA allowed me to pursue my passion for education and I hope to share that passion with my students."
