DR. BRADFORD SCHNEIDER

Humble High School, Class of 1999



Dr. Bradford Schneider is a proud 1999 graduate of Humble High School. After graduating from Humble High School, he attended the University of Mississippi at Oxford, MS. He graduated with two degrees, Psychology and Spanish, carrying a GPA of 3.8 throughout his university career.

Dr. Schneider is currently a pediatric emergency room physician at Le Bonheur Children's Hospital in Memphis.

After working for a year as a research assistant at MD Anderson, he was accepted into the University of Texas Health Science Center Medical School in San Antonio. It was during physician training there that he made the decision to become a pediatrician, stating that, "People often don't take proper care of themselves, even after a physician gives them good advice. But when it comes to their children, they pay very close attention." It is clear that his position on this matter drove him to become a successful pediatrician where he makes a difference in the lives of children, and their parents, every day.

Dr. Schneider was selected to do his internship/residency at Arkansas Children's Hospital in Little Rock. It was during this period that he made the decision to take on the subspecialty of ER care. Upon completion, he was invited to join Pediatric Specialists, PC, in Memphis, TN. Three years later, he became a partner in the firm. He is functionally fluent in Spanish and uses his language skills regularly to communicate with patients and parents who do not speak English well, providing care and comfort in situations that are often quite challenging.

During his high school career, he was a member of the Humble High tennis team. He achieved the rank of Eagle Scout in 1998. Only about 6% of active Boy Scouts achieve the rank and honor of Eagle Scout. His Eagle project involved leading a group of fellow scouts in moving a complete playground from one elementary school to another, during the summer. The complex project required extraordinary organizational skills due to the number of parts and pieces involved. His Scout Master told him that his project was one of the more difficult and complicated projects ever attempted by an Eagle candidate from their troop.

Throughout his school years, he was an active member of Atascocita Lutheran Church youth group and was involved in many volunteer projects and ministries through the church group.

During his time at Ole Miss, he was a member of Phi Kappa Psi social fraternity and was elected president of the chapter, while maintaining a high level of academic achievement.

Dr. Schneider excelled in academics and in his career, setting an example for family, friends, colleagues, and others in his sphere of influence for being earnest about the importance of good health care. He is a co-author of the paper, "Cerebral oximetry with blood index in asystolic pediatric cerebrospinal fluid malfunctioning shunt patients."

Dr. Schneider, along with his wife and three children are active in his church, Calvary Episcopal Church in Memphis.
