Glenn Redmon was a proud 1972 graduate of Humble High School. After graduating from Sam Houston State University, Glenn worked with his dad and expanded their local business into a nationally recognized custom kitchen business. He served as the President and Owner of Custom Kitchen Equipment, Inc., which specializes in creating high end commercial kitchens for companies, schools, hospitals, churches, and restaurants throughout Texas.

Glenn spent his entire life serving his community. He lived here, maintained his business here in Humble and continuously supported students who attended Humble ISD. Glenn did this with a loving heart and great generosity. He co-created with his wife, Karla, a program in 1988 called Special Kids Day. This unique program which is still in existence today was offered in conjunction with the Humble ISD Livestock Show and allows special education students to visit the Livestock Show exhibit in a safe and quiet environment. Students get to use all of their senses as they see up close, smell and touch the barn animals. This program helps able bodied students learn compassion and patience as they share their passion with other special needs students. Special Kids Day was very near and dear to his heart and an event he looked forward to every year. Glenn is an honorary FFA member in Humble, Kingwood, and Atascocita FFA Chapters for his dedication to 4H and FFA members.

His Humble High School legacy continued as he and Karla's three daughters also graduated from Humble High School. Glenn served as Project Graduation Chairman in 1997, 1999 and 2000. He was also a member of the Wildcat Boosters and fondly remembered his years on the football team when he was a sophomore and senior. In 2006, Glenn stepped up to help Humble High School pay for prom. Many students felt the impact of his love for Humble High School through the various acts of kindness that he graciously donated to each year.

Additionally, he served as a city councilman for Humble, a dedicated Rotarian and life-long member of Humble First Baptist Church. Glenn and Karla have three daughters and six grandchildren.
